Madrid

- ◆ Capital of Spain.
- ◆ Population is about 4 million people.
- ◆ Located in the center of Spain.

Universidad Antonio de Nebrija

- ◆ Top-ten Spanish university
- ◆ Only about 2800 students
- ◆ Courses will be taken at both Berzosa and Dehasa campuses

Prerequisites

- ◆ Undergraduate student
- ◆ 2.75 Cumulative GPA
- ◆ 2 semester at ISU or other college/university

Two Part Academic Program

First Four Weeks

- ◆ Intensive Spanish language courses
- ◆ Includes 6 cultural activities at no additional cost
- ◆ Additional excursions are available for additional fees
- ◆ All students are tested to determine their level of placement (levels from intermediate to superior are available).

Last Three Months

- ◆ Students will choose 5 courses
- ◆ Courses may be any combination of Business, Gen Ed, and/or Spanish language courses.
- ◆ Business and Gen Ed courses are taught in English

Cost

- ◆ ESSCA is an Exchange Program for ISU students only.
- ◆ The estimated budget includes room & board, airfare, OISP* fees, ISU reduced tuition & insurance, International Student ID Card, local transportation, books and supplies, and personal expenses.
- ◆ Financial aid is available to those who qualify. To make an appointment call 438-2231.

5. Make an appointment with the Financial Aid Office—if you qualify
6. Complete and turn in application along with required paperwork to Fell Hall Room 308 **before** the application deadline
