Most of these costs are self-explanatory. As you can see, there are 3 different types of costs: what you are billed from our office (OISP Bills to Student), what you are billed from ISU (ISU Bills Student), and costs that you have to pay independently of OISP or ISU (Independent costs paid by the student). The first two are billed through Student Accounts and are fixed costs, while the third may be billed through a variety of places and are mostly estimates. The costs in the third section are the sole responsibility of the student. All costs are subject to change.
