“The Glory that was Greece” A historical study tour of Greece

General Information

Participants on this exciting new ISU study abroad program will have the opportunity to tour the major sites of ancient Greece with specialists in ancient history. Students will visit Athens, Corinth, Sparta, Thermopylae, Olympia, Delphi, Mykonos, and other areas in order to study their history and impact on the modern world. Students will have their preconceptions of ancient Greece challenged through intensive historic study and will also learn about modern Greek culture through personal cultural interaction.

Academics

Students can take either IDS 133 (Outer Core Humanities) or HIS 220: Ancient History: Greece. In addition, students may also enroll in a History Independent Study course (HIS 287 for undergraduates or HIS 400 for graduates). HIS 220 can be applied to all History majors and minors, and all other students can use it as a university-wide elective.

Qualifications

- Good Academic Standing
- 2.5 GPA Overall
- Complete an application by December 5, 2009
- Pay deposit by January 8, 2010
- Current ISU students and non-ISU students are welcome to apply!



Site Visits

Students will begin the program in Athens visiting the Acropolis, Theatre of Dionysos, Athenian Agoras, National Archeological Museum, Olympeion, and Panathenaic Stadium. Next, the participants will travel to Corinth, and after spending the night in Nauplio, will continue to Mycenae, Tiryns, Epidaurus and end the night in Sparta.

After exploring the city of Sparta, students will have the chance to view the historic sites of Messenia, Olympia, Delphi, and Thermopylae.

Finally, the group will take a boat to the island of Mykonos and later to the island of Delos. At the end of the program, there will be a trip to Aegina Island.

Cost

The cost for this program is based largely on the number of students participating. The program fee is between \$4,133 and \$3,465. The more students that participate, the less the overall cost per student will be.

Individual costs such as tuition, insurance, airfare, additional meals, and personal expenses are not included.
